Game Setup



Starting with a set of 100 is recommended.



For those not good at geography or playing with young children, feel free to choose any flag cards and adjust the difficulty as you like.

Decide the Order

Play proceeds clockwise.

Decide who play card at first.

Shuffle the flag cards and deal 8 to each player.



Don't look at the back of the flag cards yet.
Leave them face(flag side) up on the table.



Shuffle the subject cards and place 7 in the center of the table.



Use advanced subject cards once you are familiar with the game.



Experienced players can mix in advanced subject cards for more challenge!

Third Round's Subject

(The first card played)

Prepare a total of 7 rounds' worth of subjects in the center.
Arrange them freely so everyone can see well.

1 Let's check the subject for this round!

↓ This round's subject is:



Which has a larger population...

2 Take turns playing the flag card of a country you think could win based on the subject.

It's my turn, this card!
(Japan should win...)



⚠ Instead of the center of the table, place it in front of you.

The first player plays one flag card face up (flag side). (For example, for the subject "which has a larger population," play a card of a country you think has a large population.)

Next player's turn.

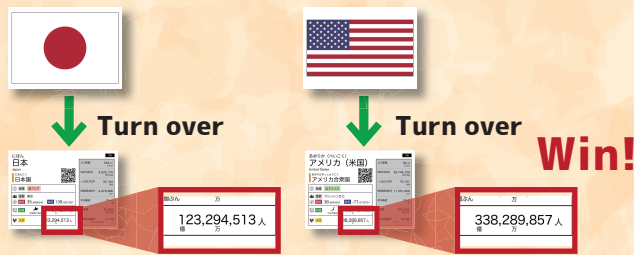
I'm betting on this one!
(Probably America, so I should win.)



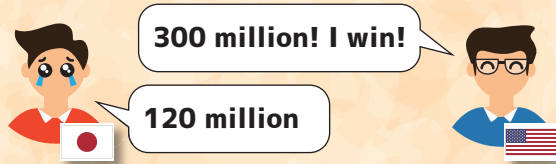
Continue clockwise until all players have played their flag cards.

3 Once everyone has played, turn the cards over to compete! The winner gains points!

Turn over and compete



This round's subject is "which has a larger population," so the player who played the flag card of the country with the largest population wins.



*In the event of a tie, no one gains points. Items marked "No Data" will always lose. They are not treated as zero. (Especially countries without military expenditure data exist about 40 countries.)

Scoring Points



Gather the cards



1 point gained!

1 point gained!

Each stack of cards counts as one point.

4 Next challenge. The winner of this round starts the next round.

⇒ 1 Back to

If the subject cards are exhausted, the game ends.

If there is a tie, the same player as the last round starts the next round.

In the event of a tie, the player who starts the next round is the same as in the previous round.

Game End

Once all seven rounds are completed, the game ends. (Each player will have one flag card left.)

The player with the most points accumulated is the Flagenius! Congratulations!!
